Smiles for Stanley

We received an email this week asking for support for a fundraising campaign. Please find the details below:

Hello

In April this year my 18 month old son, Stanley, was diagnosed with stage 4 high risk neuroblastoma that requires 18 month intensive treatment including high dose chemotherapy, invasive surgery, stem cell transplant, radiotherapy, immunotherapy and cis-retinoic acid therapy. After all this exhaustive therapy there is still a 50% chance of relapse from which there is only a 10% survival rate. There is a clinical trial in America that significantly increases these odds in Stanley's favour so in association with Solving Kids Cancer we are raising funds to access this life saving treatment.
