School start times, holidays in term times and parking

- As you know we have a lot to fit into our school day. The bell for the start of the day rings at 8.50am so that we can unload our bags, take the registers and the dinner orders and be ready raring to go for a fun filled day of learning at 9am! We would be really grateful therefore if you could ensure that your children are at school before the bell rings at 8.50am. If your child arrives after the session has begun they will be marked as late.
- There has also been concerned expressed by two villagers to a governor about the speed that some cars drive around the school area and how cars are parking. Police advice is very much that as long as road tax is paid you are able to park in the village, bearing in mind that drives and open roads should not be blocked. Common sense will let you know where and how you can park!
- May we also politely ask that parents refrain from parking across the school car park area by Class 1 as this can make it very difficult for teachers arriving and leaving.
- Governors have also expressed concern about the slight increase in parents requesting holidays in term time. Please consider the guidance, which is sent out with each form, very carefully before you submit a request. Mrs Metcalfe has, and will, continue to consider each request individually

and will remain empathetic to those families who are genuinely unable to take holidays during the normal time.
