#### Message from the Governing Body

Dear Parents and Carers. May I offer you all a warm welcome at the start of our new academic year 2018/2019. We are truly blessed to belong to such a wonderful school family with dedicated and hardworking staff who all go above and beyond expectations for us all. Despite numbers increasing, our staff have maintained the caring, family ethos of which we are all so proud of here at Slingsby. Our School has gone from strength to strength under the determined leadership and resolve of our Head Teacher, Mrs Metcalfe. She has implemented robust review systems through external scrutiny and performance management of staff, resulting in rigour and robustness of her own evaluations. Her determination that the school, its staff, pupils and governors are the best that they can be has further increased. On behalf of the governing body I would like to thank each and every member of staff in school for their motivation, loyalty and unending desire to give our children the best education that they can possibly have.

The governing body meet regularly to hold the Head Teacher to account and one of the items on our agenda is always attendance. At the last meeting it was noted, from data required to be recorded by the DFE, that there has been an increase in a small proportion of children being absent on the last day of a term and the first day back. There is also evidence of a higher number of requests for holidays in term time, which is a concern and will be monitored. Whilst as a governing body we appreciate that in some circumstances it is unavoidable to take a holiday outside of the 13 weeks available, we ask that you consider carefully before requesting a holiday in term time.

We have instructed Mrs Metcalfe to only authorise requests in exceptional circumstances as per the government guidelines as follows:

There is no statutory criteria for exceptional circumstances but some of the following reasons may apply:

- Service personnel returning from active deployment
- Where inflexibility of the parents' leave or working arrangement is part of the organisational or company policy. This would need to be evidenced by the production or confirmation from the organisation/company
- Where leave is recommended as part of a parents' or child's rehabilitation from medical or emotional problems. Evidence must be provided
- When a family needs to spend time together to support each other during or after a crisis

Please note, holidays in term time are not an entitlement and a family holiday is not an exceptional circumstance. Head teachers must consider the individual circumstances of each case when making a decision on this matter. In the instance of a Penalty Notice being issued, the school office is obliged to inform the Local Authority via the Safeguarding Unit.

We would like to thank parents for their continued support of our unique and very special school. The governors of Slingsby C P School are very excited to be working with school to continue to be the best that we can be. *Mrs Sophie Wigby-Ashurst- Chair of the Governors.*
