Important information

- Class 3 will be taught by Mrs. Jordan, with teaching assistant support from Miss Coleman. Mrs Jordan will teach every morning and Wednesday, Thursday and Friday afternoons. On Tuesday afternoon the children will be taught by Mrs Metcalfe and on a Monday, Mrs Rough will teach French followed by PE with Mr Smith.
- Please try and hear your child read three times a week and comment in their reading diary, noting the pages they have read. In school, each week your child will be heard to read once within a group and once on a one to one basis with another adult.
- Spellings will be given weekly and their spelling test will be on a Friday as well as their timetables test. Please encourage your child to complete their 'look, cover, write, check' grid and write 5 sentences using words from their list. Children will move up in their timetables once they have obtained full marks for 3 consecutive weeks. The progression is from 2, 10, 5, 3, 4 (mixed 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10) and then 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, 12 followed by mixed of all 12 timetables and then followed by division facts.
- Children will require their P.E bags in school all week –PE sessions for Class 3 will take place every Monday and Friday afternoons. Children need a pair of trainers, socks, warm trousers and a jumper, as where possible PE will be outside.
- Due to space limitations in Class 3 please can we ask that where possible, children use a school book bag or avoid huge rucksacks!
