The Charlie Mortimer Fund

The Charlie Mortimer Fund is 10 years old this year. It was founded by Steve and Davina Mortimer following the unexpected loss of their son in 2009. Since then the charity has worked tirelessly to support other grieving families that have lost a child. This has involved various projects over the years including providing specialist equipment to LGI PICU and funding respite days for bereaved parents (through care for the family). Over the last 2 years, the charity has produced a children's book and developed it into a children's resource bag for siblings that have lost a brother or sister. The resource is now being used countrywide by children's hospitals, maternity units, schools and children's hospices. The charity is holding a 10th celebration fund raising auction in August and the charity are looking for donations either for the auction (in the form of anything from hampers, vouchers and promises!) or to the raffle too. There will be a box in the reception area for those that would like to support this ongoing work for a charity that school supports wholeheartedly.
