### School News

School have staffing costs to cover these activities and unless bills are paid promptly and kept up to date the school may have to make some very difficult decisions. We liken it to shopping at a supermarket...you would have to pay there and then and not wait a few weeks! *There should be no debt* and we are disappointed that we still have some. Thank you so much to the majority of parents who keep up to date with payments and to those who have raised their concerns about the debt they can see we accrue in this newsletter.

### Parent Pay- Refresher Guidance

This was in the last newsletter but we thought it would be helpful to keep these top tips in for another week! As mentioned previously, there is a new page on the school website for ParentPay Key Information. We have uploaded a number of parent guidance notes that we hope will help and assist going forward. Key points to remember:

- Scroll down the menu screen to see **ALL** outstanding arears as it only displays a few on the front screen.
- To see details of specific historic club attendances go to the menu on the left hand side and select Transaction History and then Payment History. Select which club you wish to look at and amend the date range to suit and it will list all the sessions attended.
- You can pay for clubs and dinners in advance. Money can be credited to these payment items you should not wait until they are in arears before you credit them.
- Sep up alerts on your account so that you receive notifications when your balance is low or when a new payment item has been added. To do this simply login, go to Communications, go to Alert Settings, select the type of Alert (low balance and/or new item) and select how you want to receive alerts, email and/or text. **Email alerts are free of charge**. If you opt for text alerts there is a small charge per text.
