## Slingsby Community Primary School – Spring 1 Class 1 Newsletter.

#### ICT

Children using the Tuff Cams to take video clips of stories performed with friends. Giving and following directions using the BeeBot robot. **Music** Using song to retell traditional tales. Playing instruments to match mood or create effects.

### Art/DT

Junk modelling, then modelling using plasticine and clay. Using line to enclose space to form shapes. Mixing colours.

### Maths

Adding and subtracting numbers 0-20. Recognising numerals 11-20, then beyond. To say 1 more and 1less than any number 1-20. To name and find 3D shapes around school. To measure lengths and weights using non-standard units **Physical Development** 

Exploring different ways of moving, jumping off objects and landing safely. We are learning to balance, make body shapes and how to roll safely.

- Last Friday saw class 1 posting their thank you for Christmas letters. These were addressed to home, so should have arrived over the weekend. The children have all worked hard to make a card with unused Christmas paper. They sounded out the words; thank you, using our phonic sound mat.
- The letter with information for our trip to Flamingo Land will follow in the next few days.
- Please could we ask for donations of decking plank off-cuts or bricks and breeze blocks for our outdoor area next week. Our story is The Three Little Pigs and as part of the learning we will use construction materials to design and build houses and dens. Decking planks no longer than 1.5 metres and whole bricks or blocks can be left by the side gate next to the staff car park (please do not block the path). Many thanks!
- A reminder that the sharing of 'weekend' books still takes place each Wednesday. For next week can we request that you and your child share one or more of your Christmas family traditions. This could anything from attending Christmas services in church to a picture of the family wearing matching pyjamas! It could also be photographs of a shared experience or a new tradition that you may now repeat every year. It has been lovely to see children attempting to copy or write few sentences that describe events or conversations too!
- Phonic home books will be updated this week to include some of the phase 3 letter and *most* groups have now got set 2 and 3 letter sounds to practise. The writing formation is a little small, but there as a guide for children to practise on the back of the sheet, or using paints or chalk outside.
- The children are also bringing their guided reading books home again from this week too. We have 6 copies of each book for groups of children to share so it is vitally important that these are returned to school each week.
   PLEASE write in your child's reading diary, noting the pages they have read whenever you share the books–or just sign and date it. In school, your child will be heard read once each week individually and in a guided group of 4-5 children to develop their decoding, blending and reading skills weekly.
- A reminder that all parents are welcome to attend our weekly celebration assembly on Friday 3pm-3:30 each week. This takes place in the reading rooms and is led by Mrs Metcalfe. Children receive certificates and special awards. If your child will be receiving an award, then you should receive a text message reminder by Friday lunchtime. Please ensure that we have up-to-date contact information to enable us to do this.
- We will send the games kit bags home for washing on Friday and this should be returned to school for Tuesday
  morning please. Mr Green endeavours to teach games outside whenever possible so please send warmer clothes
  (including jogging bottoms, fleece and trainers) over these winter months. Thank you
