School News

- Many thanks for your patience and understanding, it has been an eventful start to the half term with snow and unforeseen maintenance and boiler issues. Please be reassured that we do not take the decision to close school lightly and will always do all we can to avoid closure. On this occasion we were advised by NYCC that it was necessary to remain closed until further investigations had been made. Works on the boiler are ongoing but this only affects one classroom and Mrs Metcalfe's office. We are very fortunate to be given use of the Chapel School Room which is being used this week by Class 4.

After-School Clubs – please book in advance & keep your account in credit

The outstanding debt for clubs this week stands at $\underline{\texttt{£336.21}}$ and $\underline{\texttt{£166.60}}$ for lunches which is very disappointing at the start of the new half term. Parent Pay accounts are checked daily and texts are sent weekly if accumulative debt exceeds £10. Clubs and meals <u>must be</u> paid in advance and kept in credit.

The running of after school clubs is continuously under review, and will be decided upon on a weekly basis again dependant on funds. Remember to book your child into clubs in advance whenever possible and advise us at the start of every new term if your child is maintaining their regular After-School and Chill Club bookings so that we can staff accordingly.

We have received advice from the Department of Education, Public Health England and North Yorkshire County Council regarding the coronavirus/covid-19. The chance of being in contact with the virus was upgraded yesterday by the government from low to moderate in the UK, therefore, if you have recently travelled to any of the high-risk locations or been in contact with anyone suffering from symptoms, you are asked to self-isolate for up to 14 days by staying at home, avoiding public transport, work and places of education. Everyone can help to prevent the virus spreading. Please encourage your children to wash their hands with soap and water for a minimum of 20 seconds regularly, catch their coughs and sneezes in a tissue and throw it away and remind them to avoiding touching their eyes, noses and mouths. It is also a good idea to avoid sharing cups, bottles, cutlery, towels etc. This is all daily practice in school.
