Maths

- Continue to practice your times tables.
- Equivalent Fractions We have been trying to find equivalent fractions in class. Could you use strips of paper (the same length) to create a half and then fold other strips of paper in different ways to try and find fractions that are the same as a half. You could also make a paper pizza and think about how you could cut it up to make half in a different way (remember fraction parts must be equal!).
- Mental maths arithmetic adding and subtracting numbers could be written or verbal questions as well as number bonds, to 20 and 100 in multiples of 10 or random numbers. Random numbers could be found by rolling a dice, pack of cards etc.

English

- In class, we have been looking at nonsense poems. Could you look at the poem 'There was an old woman who lived in a shoe' and think about different ways you could end each line (or write new lines of your own). Start by looking at the rhyming words at the end of each line and thinking about how you could change them.
- Change the poem starting with the first rhyme.
- Where else could the woman live?
- Should we put her in a hat? Perhaps on a boat? Maybe in a drawer?

This example might help you:

There was an old woman who lived in a box It didn't have windows or doorknobs or locks She wanted to travel the world, and so She posted her house where she wanted to go.

• What is your favourite book? Could you write a review of the book to tell others why it is so good? Design a new front cover for the story.

• Could you design a poster to tell everyone why washing your hands is so important? What are you washing off your hands? What should you use?
