# **School News**

- We hope you are enjoying the heatwave and we are sure you are all feeling happier that the lockdown restrictions are easing slightly. It certainly feels to us that there is light at the end of the tunnel! The next few weeks and months are crucial and if we continue to be sensible then a full September return should be possible.
- Mrs Metcalfe has asked us to thank you for all the lovely emails you have sent her via admin and for the
  cards posted to school. She has really appreciated them and is feeling better for the break, though she is
  still working at home in some capacity. If you have any queries or communications for Mrs Metcalfe or

- The Government announced this week that social distancing will be reduced to 1m outdoors but with the recommendation that it ideally should remain at 2m indoors. This has not directly changed any of the advice for schools and in following the DfE and LA safety advice, our situation remains unchanged at the moment and regrettably we do not have the capacity to take any more children.
- We were really pleased to hear Government announcement last week that they will be providing schools
  with funding to support catch-up initiatives throughout the next academic year. We do not yet know
  what the criteria will be for such grants or how the funding will be allocated and await the details with
  interest. Aside from this, we have already been planning our own changes to next year's standard
  curriculum where we will be re-visiting areas of learning from where we left off when we closed in
  March. This will be geared at helping all our children at every level to meet their expected progress
  attainments, together with pastoral care and mental health and wellbeing. This is going to be at least a
  year long plan which will be incorporated into every aspect of school life.
- There is much negative press around at the moment about missed education and catching up for school
  pupils but the most important factor is that we seem to be coming through the pandemic and we would
  really encourage you to focus on the positives. From what we have seen and heard from you, your
  children have had so many new learning experiences and they have been growing and developing in
  amazing new ways. Adapting to living life at a very different pace in itself has been no bad life lesson! We
  strongly believe that all our children will bounce back and we are ready to work hard with them in
  September.
- We have not received any confirmation about the Government's summer catch up initiative mentioned a couple of weeks ago. The LA has been asked by the Government to look into possible outside providers to possibly run summer camps, but this is by no means decided and when we know we will let you know!
