Phonics

Learning single letter sounds (s,a,t,p,i,n) Then blending them together to read words (tin, pat, sip). Children will read books at their levelling of understanding.

ICT

Using the listening station and talk tins. Begin to point and click with a mouse using the internet site Poisson Rouge (red fish)

Understanding the World My house and my family. My house in my village or town. My class in my school. Around my school and Slingsby village- the castle, train station and dragon myth. Talk about changes by observing themselves. Changes that occur from summer to autumn. Celebrate Harvest!



Science

Talk about our feelings during weekly circle times. Discus shared rules and make a class contract linked to our Slingsby values for life. Visit chapel Making friends and getting along.

successfully when playing racing and chasing games in larger groups.

Important information

 Class 1 is taught by Mr Mortimer and Mrs Mitchell Tuesday – Friday. Mrs Mitchell will lead class 1 each Monday with support from Mrs Turner. Matthew (from Simon Carson Sports Company) will teach games on Monday morning and Mr Smith will teach games in the afternoon each Thursday with Mrs Mitchell.

Children receive stickers for good behaviour and work in class 1. When they have collected five stickers, they will bring their reward card home to use as a bookmark! Please celebrate this with them and feel free to use the bookmarks in their reading books. Merit awards are given for milestone achievements such as writing names, moving up book-band levels when reading or learning a new skill. To begin with, merits will be awarded for independent skills such as changing for PE or fastening up their own coat independently. Merit stars are collected and converted to award certificates; 5= bronze, 10= silver and 15= gold merit certificates.

• Weekend News forms part of our PSHCE (Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education) and will take place each Wednesday. In previous years we have placed a 'weekend book' in children's book bag for them to prepare their news over the weekend or early part of each week. This could be a picture that they choose to draw, photographs of a shared experience or a few sentences that describe an event or conversation. To begin with, parents write these, but we have found that increasingly children want to do it themselves as they feel confident to. These will help to work as a prompt for show and tell, giving children support to remember and share their experiences with a small group within the class.

However, this year is different. We are still sending the book home, but ask that you keep it there for now to avoid it travelling in and out of homes and school. We suggest that you take a photo or scan the weekend book page and send it via email to; <u>admin@slingsby.n-yorks.sch.uk</u>.

Please use the subject <u>Weekend news for class 1</u> and it will be forwarded straight on to me.

- The books then run alongside our learning journals to reflect the individual learning journey of each child. Remember this does not always have to be days out and special trips. Instead it might be a picture of your garden, photographs of a trip to Granny's or a painting of their pet or favourite place.
- Phonic books will be sent home soon, with instructions of how you can use them written on the inside cover. Again these will stay with you, with additional pages sent out when letter sounds are being learned.
- Usually we have an open evening a few weeks into the new term to introduce our phonic teaching and reading scheme. We will endeavour to host this via Zoom and will be in touch with dates and times soon.
