I hope you have a good week of learning and if you are at home completing this work, take care and we look forward to seeing you back in school soon.


<u>Maths</u>

Can you practice counting in 2's, 5's and 10's, maybe look at some of the counting songs on 'You tube' or time someone to complete a task by counting.

I have noticed that as a class we need to practice our number formation, it would be a great opportunity to do this. You could use a paint brush and water or even chalk so you can do this outside.

This week we are completing more work on number bonds. You could use a dice to generate numbers or on pieces of paper have 0-20. You can turn one over and see how fast you can work out what goes with this nymber to make 20. Alternatively use the dice to generate a 2 digit number, if your answer is always 100, what would go with this number.

Can you use the part, part, whole model to help?




Addition – To work on addition you could use practical objects to help you count, start with low numbers and build up.


You can use dominoes and turn them over and use this as your sum, can you write this as a number sentence?




Why not practice adding a 1 digit number to a 2 digit number e.g. 36 + 8 = You can work this out by counting on. Always use your number bond facts.

36 + 5 + 4 = 36 + 4 = 40 40 + 5 = 45







Phonics

There are still some free games on phonics play and these are a brilliant way of helping you recognise some of the phonic sounds as well as practicing; sounding out the fake / real words and blending the sounds together. We have been focussing on either phase 3 or phase 5 in phonics.
