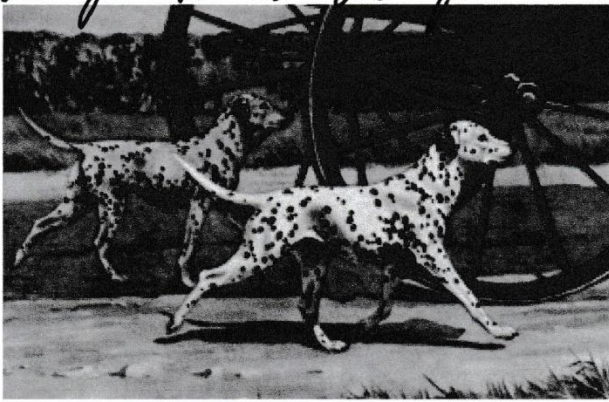


Dalmatians.
