

Hello Class 1

Use page 3 and 4 of the number formation booklet or count using the Gingerbread Man game if you haven't made it already.

Try to write a list of words with 'o' as the middle sound;

fox

box

top

pop

You can use magnetic letters to help you if you have some, or just say words out loud with a grown up. Remember to segment (stretch out) the word for spelling, then blend (push together) the sounds to read and check.

If you want a challenge, then use ck, ch or sh in the words too (shop, chop, tock)

Gingerbread man

I loved seeing Bear's story map of The Gingerbread Man. Try to make up another play version of The Gingerbread Man using toys from around your home. You might not have a cookie cutter so you could change the main character for a dinosaur, doll or action hero that is being chased by other animals or toys. You could draw the story instead if you would rather, but think about the phrase...

"Run, run as fast as you can. You can't catch me I'm the Gingerbread Man!"
