I will continue to share our class story on the website and we have an extra story time session each Monday where we discuss a book in more detail. This week our book is "Tidy" by Emily Gravett which will hopefully provoke lots of discussion on how we look after the environment. An extra resource you may like to look at from home is the

Words for Life website which is provided by the National Literacy Trust and designed especially for parents. There are lots of interesting resources on there as well as tips and ideas for activities associated with reading. This week our learning will look like this:

P.E: we will start the week by joining in with Joe Wicks.

**Phonics**: we will continue to practise reading and spelling tricky words and learn the new sounds, "igh", "oa" and "oo".

**Dough Disco**: if your child has a favourite song we could use for Dough Disco, please let me know and we will use it in class.

Literacy: the class will be receiving a letter from David Attenborough which will hopefully provide a stimulus for writing as they will need to carry out some research! Each of the children who are learning from home should receive their own copy of the letter through the post on Monday or Tuesday so watch out for the postman!

Maths: we will be learning all about volume and capacity. This will culminate in the children mixing their own fruit mocktail (heads up if you are out at the shops!)

Other subjects: we will also be learning about collage, the Seasons (Winter) and planting some spring bulbs. So lots to keep us busy!
