**Recap – A verb is a word used to describe an action, state or occurrence.**

**We are going to be focussing on action verbs.** If you can do it, then it is a verb, like sing, cry, jump. Can you think of some more? Can you show your grown up a verb?



For those in year 2 can you extend this further by using an adverb. An adverb helps us to describe the verb. Sit quietly, run quickly, jump carefully.

I have separated out the work from year 1 and 2, but please feel free to have a go at either depending on how confident you feel you are with verbs and adverbs.
