
LO: I can plan a piece of creative writing

Animal Smuggling

*'It isn't easy to smuggle a rat into school.

Write a story about the day you smuggled an animal, any animal, into school!

-  1. Start by listening to the start of **Chapter 7** on the Class 3 home learning page on the school website.

2. Now imagine what it would be like if you had smuggled an animal into school.

We are **planning** our story today, so jot ideas down, think about them, say them aloud, to yourself, or somebody at home.

Some questions to get you thinking. These will also help you to structure your writing.

- What animal did you take into school? Can you describe it?
 - Why did you want to take it in? To show your friends? Would it be lonely at home? Perhaps you found it on the way to school?
 - Where did you hide it? In your bag? Your lunchbox? Your PE bag? Under a hat?
 - What happened when you got to school? Did the animal stay hidden? Or did it escape?
3. Once you have come up with some ideas, write them down as a plan for the next step.

Think about the sequence of your writing. Stories usually have

a beginning

a middle

an end.

You can use the **planning template** on the home learning page to help you plan your story.
