Guided reading/SPAG task

This week, we are focusing on paragraphs, what they are used for and when we can place them in our writing.

To access the resources for the SPaG task this week, click the link on the timetable titled 'SPaG - paragraphs task' and 'SPaG - paragraphs input'. Just like the SPaG mats, this task can be completed at any point in the week.

Maths starter - morning tasks
