

Chinese New Year can also sometimes be called the Lunar New Year. This is because the Chinese calendar is worked out using the Moon and how much it is lit by the Sun. Each year in the Chinese calendar is named after a different animal. This year is the Year of the Ox.

Why Is Each Year a Different Animal?

One of the legends of Chinese New Year tells us that the Jade Emperor ordered 12 animals to have a race. He did this so that he could name the years and put them in order.



The Jade Emperor would name each year to show the order that the animals completed the race in. The ox helped the rat during the race. Then, the quick and cunning rat won and the ox came second. The second year was named after the ox.



When Does the Year of the Ox Start?
