Maths

Don't forget to keep practicing on 'Sumdog' and see if you can increase your score. This is always a great way of practicing your mental maths skills.

We are moving on to height and length in maths but remember to keep practicing counting in 2's, 5's and 10's both forwards and backwards. Any opportunity to keep the skills of division and multiplication fresh will be very beneficial.

Monday

Today we are looking at another standard unit of measure called metres (m). You would measure in metres for larger areas or items. There are 100cm in 1 m and 1000mm in 1m. Have another go at estimating and measuring using metres.

Tuesday

Comparing units of measure is the challenge today. Can you remember using the greater than, less than, equal too symbols? Use these to compare different units of measure. See the work for both year 1 and 2 but please feel free to complete the one that you feel more confident with.

Wednesday

We are ordering objects today and thinking about all the units of measure, can you order the dinosaurs from the tallest to the smallest?

Thursday

Today is all about problem solving using measure – challenge yourself and see if you are able to answer the questions to show a greater understanding of measure.

Friday

The final day of measuring today and then next week we will start a new maths topic! Can you complete the quiz for today?

English

Monday

For English today can you look at the picture and answer a range of questions linked to the dinosaur scene. Be as imaginative as you can.

Tuesday

I would like you today to be as creative as possible. Can you turn your name into a dinosaur? What would you eat? Where would you live and what colour would you be? I would like you to draw yourself as a dinosaur and then describe yourself to me. Please see the work for today on the internet.

Wednesday

After listening to the story 'T Rex on Tour' can you write your own postcard from the T Rex to Max? If the T Rex had visited Slingsby or your village what would they say? Remember writing a postcard is an informal piece of writing just like you are writing to a friend.

Thursday – WORLD BOOK DAY

Today for World Book Day I would like you to choose your favourite story or a part of your story and turn it into a comic strip. Alternatively, why not use your own imagination and create a comic strip of your own story.

Friday

Another SPAG lesson and today we are looking at prefixes. Have a look at the video and see if you can complete the pre-fix activities.

The focus in phonics this week is real words and tricky words. June usually sees the phonic screening check. Thursday – Art - WORLD BOOK DAY

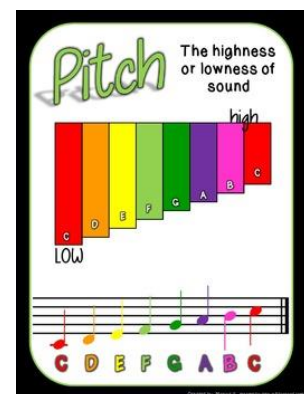
