- Spellings will be given to pupils on Monday/Tuesday and tested on the following Monday so they have the weekend to help learn them. Please encourage your child to complete their 'look, cover, write, check' grid and write 5 interesting sentences, using words from their list and a range of punctuation.
- Children will require their P.E bags in school all week including a pair of socks. PE sessions for Class 4 are timetabled to take place every Monday and Friday.
- Please actively encourage your child to learn the multiplication tables thoroughly, as sound knowledge will help their confidence in many areas of mathematics.
