Thank you for your patience and support with managing Covid-19 this half term. The children, as always, have been brilliant. This often feels like the longest and hardest half term but now that the mornings and evenings are getting lighter, we should all feel like we have a new spring in our step after half term!

As you will be aware, the Government Guidance relating to Covid-19 is changing during the half term break but we are still awaiting updated advice from the DFE and NYCC. We will let you know of any changes to our systems before we return after half term.

Following the resumption of our competitive multi-school sports activity programme, I would like to take this opportunity to explain what we are involved in and how it works. As well as our own Sport and PE Curriculum lessons which happen twice a week, we are also part of the *Primary Festival Programme* organised by Malton Community Sports Centre, *the Ryedale Schools Sports Programme, the Howardian Alliance* and the *Norton College Primary events*. These provide us (and all the local primary schools who choose to sign up) with the added opportunity to send teams to participate in competitive events such as football, basketball, dodgeball, netball and tag rugby tournaments, Multi Activity sessions, circuits, All Fun sessions, swimming galas, and cross country throughout the whole year. Unfortunately, the past two years have been affected by Covid-19 which has resulted in many planned events which we had signed up to having to be cancelled; but we are looking forward to a lot more events this spring and summer.

The events are sometimes limited on numbers because they involve many primary schools, and they are often age specific. Unfortunately, as much as we would love to, we cannot take everyone to everything. In our experience, however, this tends to work out fairly over the year because not all the children enjoy the same activities.

We always make sure all the children have the chance to represent the school at some point in the year at these events and do our best to be as fair as possible. We place huge value on being inclusive to all so we always discuss the events with the classes before they take place. Those who don't attend on one occasion are assured that they will represent the school another time at another event. I hope this helps clarify how our physical education programme works. At this point I can confirm, there are a further eight external events currently planned for the second half term.

Additionally, in order to remain physically active and in good mental health over half term, children can sign up to the 'Bound for Beijing' activity programme:

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### Bound for Beijing Activity Information to Parents/Carers

Staying active offers significant benefits to young people and has the potential to reduce stress and anxiety by providing routine and structure and increasing feelings of wellbeing. Research from Sport England on the impact of changing routines in 2021 shows that 32.4% (2.3m) of children and young people in the UK do less than an average of 30 minutes of physical activity each day.

By getting active as part of Bound for Beijing, families can enjoy benefits to their physical and mental wellbeing while exploring activities that best suit them and create strong healthy habits for the future. Every physical activity, no matter how small, can be logged online as part of Bound for Beijing on the <u>Get Set website</u>. By taking the time to have a walk outside or a dance around the kitchen, getting moving is a great way to reduce stress and boost your mood.

Our runners did incredibly well in the windy conditions and finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> place overall when all the points were tallied well done! The team won five and lost only one of their games, resulting in them being crowned 'Dodgeball Champions!' and our school name added to the trophy a fantastic achievement! ### Clubs and Parent Pay

As mentioned in last week's newsletter we have been reviewing our booking system for clubs because of the amount of debt that is regularly sitting on Parent Pay which we cannot afford to fund. An email was sent out yesterday with the club booking form for next half term explaining that clubs must be paid in advance to secure your child's place. Please pay for a whole half term block if you can, as you would with any other club outside of school that your children attend. If this is not possible, payment for all items at the start of each week would be hugely appreciated. This includes lunches which should also be paid for in advance by adding credit to Parent Pay. Please see our Parent Pay page on the school website for guidance on how to do this if you are unsure.

You can set up an automatic bank transfer to keep specific payment items in credit at all times and you can also set up a text reminder service to remind you when your balance reaches a chosen amount.

There is a current debt on Parent Pay of  $\frac{£321.86}{2}$  due for meals and clubs. Thank you for the recent payments received.

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The DFE have provided us with a link to their FAQ's regarding the children and young people vaccination programme. Children aged 5 to 11 years old who are at higher clinical risk are now eligible for vaccination.
