- A letter was sent yesterday to our KS2 children who have been invited to Maypole Dancing lessons
 from next week ahead of the Slingsby Village May Day celebrations. These sessions will be taking
 place on a Thursday after school until the May bank holiday weekend.
- Due to the Maypole dancing lessons, the KS2 catch-up maths sessions will be moved to a Tuesday temporarily from next week. Parents and carers were emailed about this on Tuesday.
- Our Local Authority Advisor spent another day in school on Wednesday this time focusing on our Safeguarding and Health & Safety procedures in school; talking to children, staff and Governors.

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- We are pleased to welcome our Governors back into school for their regular visits and meetings, which have all been taking place on Teams over the last two years. Reverend Robertson visited on Wednesday and Mrs Wigby-Ashurst will be joining us tomorrow.
- Mr Smith and Mrs Jordan both completed moderation training on Monday.
- We are very excited because tomorrow we have a special visit from the Aurora Planetarium where all the children will have the chance to learn about space and our small planet by entering a pop-up inflatable space dome!
- As part of our Primary Sport Festival programme, Class 2 will be attending the Malton Sports Centre Multi-Circuits event on Wednesday. A letter was emailed to Class 2 parents and carers yesterday.



Clubs and Parent Pay

Thank you to all those parents/carers who have booked and paid for clubs and lunches in advance already for this half term. Further to our correspondence last half term, please remember that clubs can only be booked once you have added credit to those items on Parent Pay. Credit should also be put on Parent Pay each week/half term for lunches. From this week there is now £75 debt on Parent Pay for lunches. Paying in advance provides us with a much more stable budget for running the clubs and hugely assists us with the administration. Our aim is to have zero debt on Parent Pay! At the time of writing there still remains £110.00 debt, £75 of which is lunches, and we have sent further reminder texts to families.

There was then opportunity for hearing about each other's favourite books.
