Important information

- Class 4 will be taught by Miss Secker with teaching assistant support from Mrs Clarke and Mrs Newbert.
- Please try and listen to your child read each evening and comment in their reading diary, noting the pages they have read. In school, each week your child will be heard read once with a comprehension focus and once with an inference focus.
- Children will change their reading books when they have finished their current book.
- Spellings will be given to pupils every Tuesday and tested on the following Monday so they have the weekend to help learn them. Please encourage your child to complete their 'look, say, cover, write, check' grid and write at least 3 interesting sentences in their spelling homework books, using words from their list and a range of punctuation. The children can also use their spelling work books as a place to practice their times tables for their weekly test.
- Children will require their P.E bags in school all week including a pair of socks. PE sessions for Class 4 are timetabled to take place every Monday, Thursday (Swimming at St Albans) and Friday (morning Rugby sessions).
- Please actively encourage your child to learn the multiplication tables thoroughly, as sound knowledge will help their confidence in many areas of mathematics.
