A Message from Mr Smith

We had our final Full Governing Body meeting for the year on Tuesday evening where I presented my Head Teacher Report, summarising this year in school, and we discussed our aspirations for the next academic year. It was a very productive meeting and we all feel proud of our achievements following two very turbulent years.

I am sad to announce that at this meeting our hugely valued Chair, Mrs Wigby-Ashurst confirmed that she will be standing down after representing Slingsby School as a governor, then Chair our Governors for the last six years. Following my appointment as Acting Head in September 2020, and over the last two years, she has been incredibly supportive of the measures the school put in place for the second Covid lockdown and in the improvement of our outdoor spaces which all our children enjoy very much. Whilst you may not have seen her often, she has always been busily working behind the scenes to ensure our school continues to work to being the best it can be. I would also like to say a personal 'Thank you' to Mrs Wigby-Ashurst for her fantastic support during this year, following my appointment as substantive Headteacher.
