### **School News**

- Our Vice Chair of Governors, Rev. Robertson visited school on Monday afternoon to look at RE
  in the school. He very much enjoyed his visit and was amazed at how confident and keen our
  pupils were in every class.
- The school nurses were here on Monday to take height and weights measurements for those children in Reception and Year 6 as part of the National Child Measurement Programme.
- Class 1 enjoyed their second swimming lesson yesterday. We are still short for the transport
  costs so if you haven't already and are able to pay a contribution for your child's transport costs
  via Parent Pay, it would be hugely appreciated.
- Mrs Jordan attended her SENDco training course at Ripon and York University on Wednesday.
- The second Maypole Dancing lesson is taking place after school today. The children were full of enthusiasm after the first session last week!
- Tomorrow, Class 4 will have a morning at Nunnington Hall with Ryevitalise, where the children will spend time taking part in and exploring four different activities linked to Geography, Science, Writing and World War II. Children should wear their uniform with warm outdoor layers and suitable footwear.
- Mr Smith has a meeting tomorrow with Mr Hogarth of the Slingsby Sports and Social Club to discuss ways the school can support the fantastic proposed improvements of the club facilities. Run by a team of dedicated volunteers, Slingsby Sports Club and Field has been a centre of community activities since at least the 1920's and is also a vital resource for Slingsby School. The club is currently seeking planning permission to extend and improve the facilities available to the village which will hugely benefit the whole community including all the children at Slingsby school. ### Cyber Security

Cyber-crime is an ever-increasing problem, with the number of victims growing exponentially over the past few years including schools. You may have heard about the cyber-attack this week on W H Smith. Understanding cyber security is essential to protect networks, devices, and data from cyber-attacks and we are ALL responsible for it by regularly changing passwords, looking out for phishing emails and securing our devices.

By way of reassurance for you, we take cyber safety and security very seriously. North Yorkshire Education Digital Services provides our school with an internet filtering service to keep our school safe using firewall features, intrusion detection and prevention, and Gateway anti-malware to name just a few. They also back up our systems weekly. In addition, all staff and governors are currently undertaking the latest cyber security training courses including that provided by GCHQ's National Cyber Security Centre. We are also registered to with the Police Cyber Alarm System.
