Everyone who took part did incredibly well and I was so proud of the way our pupils supported each other. The races took place in two heats, with the times recorded; then points allocated: 9 points for 1<sup>st</sup> place, and 1 point for 9<sup>th</sup> place. For one of the smallest schools that attended, they did amazingly well to finish in 4<sup>th</sup> place in the overall standings – an amazing achievement which they should be very proud of. Swimming certificates will be presented at this week's Celebration Assembly on Friday for individual racers and relay teams who finished in the top three.

Last week's house point competition was probably the closest result yet this year, with only 2 dojo points separating first and second place! Congratulations go to Griffin for managing to end Pegasus' amazing run of victories this half term!

It is World Book Day after half term on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March and this year our theme is Bedtime Stories. We will be asking the children to come to school dressed in their pyjamas or onesies, and to bring their favourite bedtime book in to school to share with their friends. We will be having a day of activities where the children will be divided into their Houses and will work their way around a carousel of fun activities.
