# **Eco Schools Update - How pollinator friendly will you BEE this summer?**

Eco Schools News: Tuesday 20th May is World Bee Day.

World Bee Day is observed on 20<sup>th</sup> May each year to draw attention to the essential role bees and other pollinators play in keeping people and the planet healthy. The theme for 2025 is *Bee inspired by nature to nourish us all.* Bees are pollinators, each bee can pollinate up to 100 plants in just one flight. Bees can account for up to 70% of all pollination of plants and crops in the UK. Pollination is essential for supporting the production of crops, including fruits, vegetables, nuts and seeds. Did you know there are over 20,000 species of bee in the world of which 270 of them are in the UK?

Sadly, the number of bees worldwide is in decline. In the UK, wild bees and bumblebees are particularly affected. This decline is attributed to various factors including habitat loss, the use of harmful chemicals in agriculture and climate change.

**So, what can we do to help?** In our outdoor area at school, we have several bug hotels which can provide shelter to wild bees. Also, we have sown wildflower seeds to help attract bees and other pollinators providing nectar. At home you could allow lawn 'weeds' to flower by cutting less often. Why not try No Mow May? Honey bees gather nectar from four million flowers to make one kilo of honey. Try and buy honey and other hive products from your local beekeepers or trusted brands whose honey can be traced back to a beekeeper.
