• Additional Information

- Spellings will be given to pupils every Tuesday and they will be tested on the following Monday, so children have the weekend to help learn them. Please encourage your child to complete their homework tasks in their spelling homework books and to practise online, using resources from The Spelling Shed.
- All children will read once a week in a guided reading group as well as having the opportunity to read independently first thing every morning. We also encourage you to listen to your child read at home as often as possible. Home reading books can be changed when children have finished reading their current book, they can leave books that need changing in the basket in class.
- Children will require their PE bags in school **all week** - including a pair of socks. PE sessions for Class 3 are timetabled to take place every Tuesday and Thursday.
- Please actively encourage your child to learn the multiplication tables thoroughly using TTRS, as sound knowledge will help their confidence in many areas of mathematics. All children will have a daily 3-minute test to practice their times tables and a more formal test on Friday.
- In June all the Y4 children will do the national Multiplication Tables Check. They will be tested on all the times tables up to the 12 times tables. This is a timed test, children only have 6 seconds in order to answer the question so good knowledge and recall is essential. The following website is useful for timed practises:
